Welcome to your step-by-step guide to SUPPRELIN[®] LA

Your healthcare provider has prescribed SUPPRELIN LA. Unlike other prescriptions your child may have received in the past, a SUPPRELIN LA prescription requires a few steps before starting treatment. To begin the treatment process, enroll in the SUPPRELIN LA Support Center by returning the enclosed patient authorization form. The SUPPRELIN LA Support Center is here for you throughout the treatment experience.

Important Safety Information

- SUPPRELIN LA, like other GnRH agonists, may cause a temporary increase in the blood levels of specific hormones associated with the onset of puberty (estrogen in girls and testosterone in both sexes) during the first week of treatment. This increase may temporarily worsen puberty symptoms during the first week, additionally, you may see new symptoms appear during this period. Within 4 weeks of treatment with SUPPRELIN LA, hormonal suppression generally occurs and the physical signs of puberty should decrease.

What is SUPPRELIN® LA?

SUPPRELIN LA is used to treat your child for central precocious puberty (CPP). It is an implant that releases medication through a small, thin, flexible tube made of the same material as a soft contact lens. The implant is placed just under the skin of your child's inner upper arm.



SUPPRELIN® LA:

3.5 cm long and 3 mm in diameter
(Implant shown actual size)

For a full year, SUPPRELIN LA continuously releases a steady flow of medicine known as histrelin. SUPPRELIN LA lowers sex hormone levels and keeps them down for 1 full year.

Important Safety Information

- Your doctor should monitor the levels of specific hormones associated with puberty progression, 1 month after starting SUPPRELIN LA and then every 6 months thereafter. Every 6-12 months, height and bone age should be also monitored by your doctor.

STEP 1: A prescription for SUPPRELIN[®] LA

If you have received a SUPPRELIN LA (histrelin acetate) subcutaneous implant prescription to treat your child for central precocious puberty, then Step 1 is already done. Your prescription for SUPPRELIN LA allows you to enroll in the SUPPRELIN LA Support Center. The Support Center will process the order of SUPPRELIN LA for your child in a timely manner.

Indication

SUPPRELIN[®] LA (histrelin acetate) subcutaneous implant is used for the treatment of children with central precocious puberty (CPP).

Important Safety Information

- SUPPRELIN LA should not be used by women who are or may become pregnant, and in patients who are allergic to gonadotropin releasing hormone (GnRH) or GnRH agonist analogs. Safety and effectiveness in children under 2 years of age has not been determined.

STEP 2: Complete the enclosed Patient Authorization Form

The most important step you need to take to initiate SUPPRELIN[®] LA treatment in a timely manner is to complete and return the Patient Authorization Form. This form enrolls you in the Support Center and assigns you to a dedicated representative.

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NOTE: When the SUPPRELIN LA Support Center receives your SUPPRELIN LA prescription from your doctor, they may call you to reinforce how important it is to return the Patient Authorization Form.

Support Center services include:

Clarification: Helps identify copays and deductibles

Financial Assistance: SHARES, a financial support program that includes copay assistance for eligible families

Information: Notifies you about important phone calls you will receive

Coordination: Coordinates shipment of the SUPPRELIN LA implant from a specialty pharmacy to the procedure center

Frequently asked questions

Q: Why is it important for me to complete and return the Patient Authorization Form?

A: Without your authorization, a Support Center representative cannot contact you or help you through the treatment process. Throughout the process, you can be assured that your information will remain confidential and will only be shared with necessary parties.

Q: What is a specialty pharmacy?

A: A specialty pharmacy is a pharmacy that mails out medications that have complex reimbursement issues. SUPPRELIN® LA is an example of a medication you get through a specialty pharmacy. Specialty pharmacies will only mail out SUPPRELIN LA after they receive a prescription from your doctor and have confirmed payment information.

Q: When the SUPPRELIN® LA implant leaves the specialty pharmacy, where does it go and how is it delivered?

A: Once you enroll, your personal SUPPRELIN LA Support Center representative will arrange with the specialty pharmacy to have the implant delivered directly to the procedure center. You do not have to pick it up and should not have it delivered to your house.
